Papillion School Volunteering on Headley Heath

Last term Emperor Class were working with the Ranger at Headley Heath and I would like to share the following feedback from Theo the National Trust Ranger at Headley Heath:

"It has been a real pleasure to have some of the children and teachers from Papillion School join me volunteering on Headley Heath. The main task we have been doing is tree popping. To do this we use a specialised tool to remove saplings, roots and all, from the ground.

The enthusiasm shown by some of the student was a pleasure to see, and it quite quickly became positive and spirited competition to see who could pop the biggest tree, something I even see in some of my adult volunteers. One student, Cameron, would become quite engrossed in the task, quietly popping away, clearing a lot of ground, while Joe and Stuart would be displaying their well-earned trophies for all to see, and David would sometimes forgo the tools altogether and test his strength, and usually win, against the silver birch we were trying to remove.

The staff were wonderful to work with as well, encouraging the children to try the task, providing constant positive reinforcement while making sure everyone had something to do, from Cassius and James loading up the bags to Yara taking photos as media managers, even acknowledging that some of the students were not too interested in the physical side of the activity but would rather soak up their surroundings in a beautiful place we are lucky enough to have so close to us."
