Dear Parents/Guardians,

It has been a very busy two weeks at Papillon. Last week we had our Ofsted inspection which went well. Many children gave a warm welcome to the inspectors and introduced themselves and their peers. Some children spoke directly to the inspectors about how they feel about their school, their likes and any dislikes. All children had been prepared for the visitors through photos and personal profiles being shared with them. Aahil was especially excited to ask one of the inspectors about their woodwork hobby as he wanted to know if he made wooden toys! Well done, Aahil!

This week we have had a few colds, bugs and viruses doing the rounds at Papillon. Can I please ask that if your child is not well enough to attend school, that they stay home until they are feeling better. These illnesses are spreading fast and impacting both pupils and staff. We are working hard on teaching the children to use tissues and throw these in the bin and some classes have created "snuffle stations" with everything needed to do so.

I sent a separate Arbor email this week with Surrey's advice on Strep-A and Scarlett Fever. We have not had any confirmed cases of this at Papillon but please do read the attachment (also included in this email) from Surrey which includes symptoms to look out for and guidance should your child become unwell. Next Friday will be the last day of term and the children will finish at 2pm. Please do ensure your child's transport are aware that they will need to pick the children up at 2pm next Friday.

Weather

It has been extremely cold, especially towards the end of this week. We have been working hard to ensure that all pupils understand that they need to wear their coats to go outside. If they are unable to put their coat on, they have been remaining indoors at playtimes. We would really appreciate parents supporting this message as we know that some of our children do struggle to wear coats in the winter. Some children are unable to express if they feel cold, some don't feel the cold as strongly, and some are struggling with the change in weather and consequently the need to wear a coat.

If you could please ensure that your child has their coat in school every day, and a hat, scarf and gloves if they are able to tolerate these, it will help us to reinforce the need for winter clothes during this very cold spell. We have been using visuals and learning about clothes associated with different weather conditions in morning circles this school year. Many children are developing a good understanding of the need to wear winter clothes and why.

Snow has been forecast to arrive next week. We will continue to monitor the weather and conditions near to school and should there be any need to close the school at any point, you will receive an Arbor message to inform you of this.

Headlice

We have had a case of headlice in Lower Primary this week. Can you please check your child's hair and treat them if necessary. Thank you.

Children's Christmas Fair

This will take place on Thursday 15th December. If you have any donations of toys or books that are in a good condition, could you please send these in by Tuesday 13th December. We would also like to ask for any

donations of cakes to be sent in next week for the Christmas fair (no nuts please).
