Dear Parents/Guardians,

It has been a busy first full week back for our Papillon children and young people. Community visits have mostly resumed, as well as off-site physical activities. Monarch and Admiral had a particularly good first week at cycling this week, and Woodland and Meadow enjoyed a trip to Priory Park together. Emperor Class resumed service in their Enterprise work, running the school café and car washing services for staff. Their new menu of various paninis is particularly inspiring and appreciated by staff, and they are looking into how they can maximise their profits this school year!

Unfortunately, some activities were unable to go ahead this week due to the Covid outbreak in school and reduced staffing levels because of this. We were fortunate not to have to close classes, despite the significant staff absences. A big thank you to our therapy team who have all been supporting across the school in classes this week and well done to all our children who have coped remarkably well with the staffing changes and alterations to some timetabled activities.

Thank you to all of you who kept your children home due to them being unwell whilst we managed this difficult situation in school. I am pleased to say that some staff have returned to school today and we expect more to return on Monday. Can I please remind you that should your child become unwell with symptoms, and/or if they are not well enough to attend school, it is important that they remain home to avoid the spread of contagious illnesses to other children and staff. If they test positive for Covid, children should remain home for 3 full days after the testing day. Thank you.

Secondary Department News

Swallowtail Class have had a great week experiencing lots of new activities. They had a trip to Morrisons on Tuesday to buy ingredients for savoury muffins which were cooked on Wednesday, and they enjoyed eating them on Thursday! This was their first experience of cooking in the life skills room as they are now in Secondary, which was very exciting! They also enjoyed their first horse-riding trip this week. In ICT they made flip animation booklets, and they shared their good work with their peers in their class.

Monarch Class have had a fantastic week continuing to settle into some new routines. This week marked the start of our physical activity, cycling, where all learners engaged and enjoyed trying out different bicycles, seeing who could get the most laps in the allotted time. Monarch Class also showed excellent understanding of electricity, being able to name places where we may get electricity, as well as sorting objects into whether they use electricity or not. We also continued to develop our independence and knowledge of foods around the world, creating our own stir-fried noodles, complete with another page for our individual recipe books.

Admiral Class have had a fabulous second week. We have been for a lovely walk up on Box Hill, and started our cycling at the track in Epsom. The weather was especially kind to us! Creatively the class have started learning about how to use their bodies as percussive instruments, with a little bit of influence from watching some Stomp! Videos. We have been exploring what sort of things we do to keep our minds and bodies healthy, and there have been some varied activities put forward such as playing tennis, talking to friends, going for walks to get fresh air and eating a balanced diet - which we discovered doesn't mean eating whilst standing on one leg! The class have also been working on their tracking skills by trying to follow subtle clues around the school grounds in order to reach a particular end point. his will turn a little more competitive next week when we have to work together in teams!

Emperor Class were joined by Michael from Admiral Class this week to go cycling at the David Weir Centre in Carshalton where they all enjoyed the sunny weather. They all practised their money skills when ordering a drink and snack in the café. The class are learning to increase their independence in the kitchen this term when making a simple snack or meal. They are being encouraged to reflect on their efforts and think of ways that they can improve what they are cooking. In science this week the class took part in a couple of experiments looking at changes in volume of ice and water and trying to predict quickest and slowest ways of changing ice to water. The class went shopping for resources for the class run café and then took part in their first class run café of the year. All the students did extremely well and managed to prepare a large number of paninis for adults.
