

Swallowtail Class have had a busy week! We continued with our scientific interest projects whilst some of us explored a range of electrical items and their functions. In P.E, we practiced our dribbling and evasion skills where the children had to avoid the cones and control the ball as they navigated through the course. In our maths sessions we developed our understanding of comparing data by creating/reading a range of tables and graphs.
