Monarch Class have had a lovely week! Joshua has been exceptional, independently showing the ability to deliver both TacPac and Sensory Massage to another person. It is wonderful to watch his confidence bloom! The class have also engaged extremely well with music sessions showing impressive engagement when recording their own sounds and tunes. This week Monarch Class have also had some fantastic conversations surrounding child exploitation and how to avoid different 'risky' situations; we were all very impressed by everyone's maturity and ability to recognise when and why a situation might not be safe.

Admiral Class have been learning about what people need to stay healthy this week. We have been learning about what types of food to eat and how much of each food group to eat. In our maths sessions we have been looking at weighing scales that are used in the kitchen, learning how to read the marks on the scales. In English we have been learning about what care different people need at different stages of their life. This week it was World Book Day and it was great to see the pupils in their costumes. In our outdoor learning session we looked at how the season is changing and how plants are starting to show signs of life. This week in making everybody has made some beautiful gifts for their mums.
